

Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Reporting- Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

September 30, 2022

Item 1

An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned the certification and agreement form and that the institution has used or intends to use the funds to provide the mandated amount of at least 50% of the emergency financial aid grants to students.

- Murray State College signed and returned the Certification and Agreement to the Department of Education. MSC intends to use no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Item 2

The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received under the HEERF student portion

- Murray State College will receive a total of \$3,265,512 as result of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, and the American Rescue Plan Act from the Department of Education for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Item 3

Of those funds, the total amount that has been distributed to students as of the date of reporting (i.e. the first 30-day deadline, and then every 45 days thereafter).

- Murray State College has disbursed \$3,265,512 to students.

Item 4

The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and therefore eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant.

- 2030 students were eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant.

Item 5

The total number of students who have received an emergency financial aid grant.

- 2030 students were eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant.

Item 6

How the institution determined which students did or will receive emergency financial aid grants and how much funding they did or will receive.

- 2030 students were eligible to receive an emergency financial aid grant. 647 students were deemed PELL eligible and 1383 students were not. It was determined for students who were PELL eligible to receive \$590 and non-PELL eligible students to receive \$490.
